Landfill Donates \$5,000 to York County Food Bank to Support Local Services

YORK, Pa. (Nov, 24, 2020) – Modern Landfill has always been dedicated to being a good neighbor and supporting the communities it serves. That mission takes on a whole new meaning as the holidays approach during these unprecedented times.

With the demand for charitable food services on the rise because of COVID-19, Modern Landfill and Republic Services are donating \$5,000 to the York County Food Bank to ensure residents and families in need have access to healthy, nutritious meals in their communities.

The grant will help the food bank with its overall mission to serve York County, while also providing direct support to Emmanuel UMC of Windsor in Windsor Township, Eastern York Food Pantry in Lower Windsor Township, and Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen in York. Each facility will receive \$1,000 to help local families; the food bank will receive \$2,000 for county-wide assistance.

"Making sure families in need have food on their tables during this crisis is made possible because of support from the state, generous charitable donations like this one from Republic Services, and the tireless work of volunteers who are committed to helping their neighbors," York County Food Bank President and CEO Jennifer Brillhart said.

Emmanuel UMC of Windsor, Eastern York Food Pantry and Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen all serve as local food distribution sites for the York County Food Bank.

The grant is part of Republic Services' "Committed to Serve" initiative, which is investing \$20 million nationally to recognize frontline employees and support small businesses and community groups that power local economies and help neighbors in need.
