



Part 2: Modern Landfill's Economic Impact

Local and state impact of landfill is substantial.



YORK, Pa. (Feb. 5, 2021) – Modern Landfill is an integral part of the local economy and its critical infrastructure, providing jobs for local residents and affordable, responsible waste disposal and recycling services for neighbors.

With its 35 full-time employees, most of whom live locally, Modern Landfill has been a community asset for nearly 50 years, providing safe and environmentally responsible waste disposal services for commercial, residential and industrial customers in central Pennsylvania and neighboring communities.

Modern Landfill's annual payroll totals \$2.77 million, with generous benefits. Employees give back to their communities. But that's only part of the story. The facility also relies on locally contracted hydrogeologists, engineers, groundwater technicians, stormwater technicians and laboratories to ensure safe operations.

Even amid an economic slowdown, Modern Landfill remains a reliable revenue source for the commonwealth. Over the last two years, the facility has paid nearly \$10 million in state-mandated tipping fees to support Pennsylvania's budget programs.

Locally, the facility receives approximately 50% of all municipal solid waste generated in York County through its partnership with York County Resource Recovery Center (YCRRC) to accept all ash residue, and it accepts York County waste that cannot be processed by YCRRC, like construction and demolition waste and non-hazardous industrial waste from most of York County's manufacturers

The case is clear: Every York County resident is served by and benefits directly from Modern Landfill, which remains an essential part of enabling prosperity and environmental stewardship for generations to come.
