



Modern Landfill Supports Local Schools

Real estate taxes help fund Eastern York, Red Lion school districts

YORK, Pa. (June 25, 2021) – With another school year in the books, a new fiscal year is set to begin July 1 for our local school districts, which recently wrapped up their annual budget discussions. Modern Landfill’s investments remain an integral part of the local education landscape.

In 2020, Modern Landfill paid more than \$240,000 in real estate taxes to school districts within its service area, including \$135,225 to the Eastern York School District and \$105,615 to Red Lion Area School District.

Last year, Modern Landfill proposed an expansion of its operations in Lower Windsor Township. With an expansion, should York County’s assessment stay consistent, the likely assessed value of the proposed expansion area would materially increase real estate revenue to Eastern York School District.

If Modern Landfill is unable to expand, its closure would likely lower the landfill properties’ assessed value and substantially decrease the property taxes paid to **both** school districts and local governments.

The lost revenue has serious implications for school administrators trying to plan for the future.

We recognize the proposed Modern Landfill expansion is a sensitive subject, but there can be no question about the considerable economic and community benefits it brings to York County, especially local schools districts.
