



DYK: Host Community Agreements

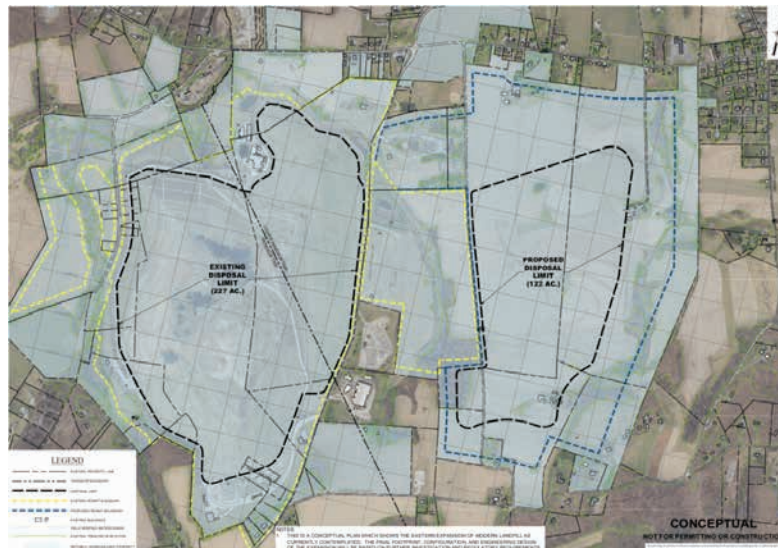
Negotiated agreements ensure municipalities & residents share benefits

YORK, Pa. (Dec. 2, 2021) – Modern Landfill operates in both Windsor Township and Lower Windsor Township — and the facility has separate host community agreements with both municipalities.

These host agreements result from good-faith negotiations between the townships and the landfill, and they ensure long-term support for local government services and community initiatives — all for the benefit of residents and neighbors.

Sometimes, these host agreements must be re-visited, such as when an expansion is needed, as is the case today.

Right now, about 70% of Modern Landfill’s acreage is in Windsor Township, with the remaining 30% in Lower Windsor Township. Under the proposed expansion plans, the operational footprint would shift to 100% in Lower Windsor Township on land owned entirely by Republic Services, Modern Landfill’s parent company.



This shift comes with a new level of responsibility, which is why Modern Landfill has been working to negotiate a new host agreement with Lower Windsor Township to build on our existing commitments. **It’s what good neighbors do.**

Unfortunately, after working in good faith for more than two years, Lower Windsor Township supervisors, in a surprise move and without advance notice, voted in December 2020 to end negotiations. That decision could have profound consequences for York County businesses and residents, especially those living in Lower Windsor Township. If the landfill closes, the Township must find a way to make up for the lost revenue and community support.
