



Leadership Change at Modern Landfill

With Tim O'Donnell's retirement, Jay Enoch takes the helm.

RED LION, Pa. (Aug. 21, 2023) – The top post at Modern Landfill is changing hands.

Tim O'Donnell, general manager of Modern Landfill and Republic Services' central Pennsylvania division, has announced his retirement, effective this fall. Longtime Republic employee Jay Enoch will take over the position.

"I am proud of the experienced team of professionals we have at Modern Landfill and throughout our central Pennsylvania operations," said O'Donnell, who is staying on until the end of October to help with the transition.

"Jay knows our operations inside and out, he is a trusted friend to all our neighbors and partners, and he lives our values," O'Donnell continued. "I cannot think of a better person to lead the team, and I am excited for what the future holds both for him and Republic Services."

Enoch has been with Republic Services for 12 years, spending time as an assistant division controller, as a division controller, and most recently as a division manager, where he has overseen operations in York for the last five and a half years.

With his promotion to general manager of the central Pennsylvania business unit, he will oversee Modern Landfill, two hauling divisions in York and Lancaster, and a transfer station in Highspire.

"I cannot thank Tim enough for his mentorship, or for the confidence Republic Services has in me to lead this team," Enoch said. "I am eager to get to work and build on the outstanding partnerships we have with our neighbors and friends and the communities where we operate."

The transition will have no effect on waste disposal or recycling services.

"Commercial, residential, and industrial customers will continue to receive the high standard of quality service that they have come to expect from Republic Services," Enoch said.

Enoch is a lifelong resident of central Pennsylvania. He and his wife, Katie, have been married for 12 years and have three children, Teagan, 8, Octavia, 6, and Willow, 4. O'Donnell began his 35-year career in 1988 as an environmental engineer with Waste Management. He worked at landfills in Berks and Butler counties before moving to York County in 1996 to become general manager of Modern Landfill.

Except for a brief period in 2013, he has served as president of the Pennsylvania Waste Industries Association since 2006.

Republic Services purchased the landfill from Waste Management in 1999 and has owned and operated the facility ever since.
